



About the Program

The Summer Intensive MRE consists of a combination of summer coursework on campus at Holy Spirit College and online coursework through Pontifex University during the school year. Students will be able to earn the degree over the course of three summers and one final semester.

The program is not simply an accumulation of coursework, but provides background in the content and pedagogy to help you educate students in the classical Western tradition.

FAQ

Q: When during the summer are these classes scheduled?

A: Live classes on campus at Holy Spirit College will generally occur during the month of June. Students will also complete some Pontifex coursework online during the summer at their own pace; they will have access at the start of the summer semester and may complete the course throughout the summer.

Q: What is the cost of this program?

A: \$400/month for 31 months. This equates to approximately 30 percent less than the fully live version of the degree.

Q: Am I completely on my own to complete the online courses?

A: No! While students will complete these courses at their own pace during the semesters they choose, each online course will have a live HSC faculty member attached to provide support.

Q: What does the practicum consist of?

A: Students will complete a final project/paper during this semester, related to their position as an educator in a school, church, or elsewhere, and will graduate in December.

Q: When can I start the program?

A: The College will start a new cohort each summer, and students may take the courses in various orders, though any new student will start with Introduction to Sacred Theology through Pontifex at the start of their first summer.
